#### **ABOUT THE MUSICAL ARTISTS**

The ARE (Russel Gonzalez) is a producer/DJ from Houston, who's produced records for talents such as Keyshia Cole, Lil' Kim, Beenie Man, among others. A big record collector, he's been producing/djing for about 17 years, and collects/specializes in funk, soul, hip hop, and

more. He's also part of the legendary production team Trackmasters out of NY (Notorious B.I.G, Nas, Jay-Z, Mary J. Blige, to name a few).

DJ **Baby Jae** is "The Infamous Party Rocker." An award-winning radio personality, turntablist, producer, performer, and co-founder of The All Mighty Kracker Nuttz, Baby Jae has been behind the turntables since the age of 11. ## **CURRENT EXHIBITIONS**

Free from the land-use and zoning ordinances that shape other large American cities by separating residential, commercial, and industrial areas, Houston allows a mixed-use approach where disparate architectures and functions blend.
