## CAMH Announces Staff and Visitor Experience Changes



Seba Raquel Suber, newly promoted CAMH Deputy Director

Houston, TX, August 23, 2021—Contemporary Arts Museum Houston (CAMH), announces key staff transitions and promotions as the museum looks to the new season of exhibitions and events. Three leaders at CAMH, Seba Raquel Suber, Kenya Evans, and YET Torres, have been promoted to expand their roles as Deputy Director; Visitor Engagement Manager and Preparator; and Public Programs and CAMHLAB Manager respectively. Former Deputy Director Janice Bond has moved into a consulting role and she continues to support the CAMH team and provide leadership to multiple engagement and experience initiatives. These staff changes—along with the arrival of Allison Glenn, Senior Curator and Director of Public Art—align with the institution’s shift toward a more active visitor experience with the newly-formed Visitor Engagement Team becoming an extension of CAMH’s Education and Public Programs team, led by Felice Cleveland.

Seba Raquel Suber, the former Director of Finance and Strategic Resources has been promoted to Deputy Director, and brings to the role over 15 years of experience in arts and culture non-profit, government, and corporate sectors with a specific focus on Black art, culture, organizational strategy, and sustainability. The expansion of her role includes overseeing all museum operations with a focus on strategic leadership across the museum. In her time at CAMH, she has worked alongside CAMH’s leadership team to help reshape the organization through thoughtful, inclusive planning and programming.
