HOUSTON, TX (December 28, 2016)—The Contemporary Arts Museum Houston is pleased to announce the launch of the Gamson Artist Lecture Series, which brings world-renowned contemporary art voices to Houston to discuss the process and inspiration behind their work and what it means to be a contemporary artist working today. Artist Jim Hodges will be the first artist in this series, sharing images and stories about his work and recent exhibitions. The inaugural lecture takes place on **Thursday, January 19, 2017, 6:00–7:30PM**, at MATCH. The event is free but tickets are required.

Hodges is a truly unique artist whose work ranges from the fragile poetry of his celebrated flowers drawn on napkins and waterfalls of dissected artificial flowers, to his grand public statements of partially mirrored boulders on permanent view at the Walker Art Center and his new public work outside The Contemporary in Austin Texas, the words “With Liberty and Justice For All” written in seven foot high letters. Says Heather Pesanti, Senior Curator of The Contemporary Austin, “The words themselves proclaim the fraught

but aspirational tenet of this country's Pledge of Allegiance, one that has complicated roots in religion and patriotism and that has so often been misused and denied, yet embodies an eternal and ongoing ideal." Like all of his oeuvre, this work denies any easy analysis and grows more complicated over time.

Hodges has a long history with the museum and CAMH's director Bill Arning. Arning curated one of Hodges's first solo exhibitions at White Columns in 1993 and wrote for Hodges's major retrospective *Give More than You Take*, organized by the Dallas Museum of Art and Walker Art Center in 2013–2014. Hodges's work was exhibited at CAMH in *Outbound: Passages From the '90s* in 2000 and his film *Untitled* was screened for World AIDS day in 2010.

ABOUT JIM HODGES

Jim Hodges was born in 1957 in Spokane, Washington, and lives and works in New York. His work has been the subject of numerous solo exhibitions at institutions including: the Centre Georges Pompidou, Paris; Camden Art Centre, London; the Aspen Art Museum; CGAC, Santiago de Compostela, Spain; Tang Teaching Museum and Art Gallery at Skidmore College, Saratoga Springs, New York; and the Museum of Contemporary Art, Chicago. Most recently a major traveling retrospective of Hodges's work was exhibited at the Institute of Contemporary Art, Boston; Walker Art Center, Minneapolis; the Dallas Museum of Art; and the Hammer Museum, Los Angeles. Hodges has received multiple awards and grants including the Association International des Critiques d'art, the Albert Ucross Prize, Washington State Arts Commission, and the Penny McCall Foundation Grant.
